Groundcovers: Hardy, low maintenance plants that protect the soil, provide cover for ground-dwelling fauna and add colour and texture to your garden

Dianella congesta Flax lily	 Clumping plant to 1m Self-maintaining once established Blocks weeds Attractive foliage, flowers and fruit Birds including Lewin's honeyeaters that eat fruit Creates microclimate for invertebrates 	
Gahnia sieberiana Red-fruited saw sedge	 Sedge to 2m Slow but hardy Attractive foliage Dense cover for small birds, insects, skinks Works well aesthetically and for habitat value as 'mass planting' 	
Lomandra histrix Creek mat rush	 Sedge to 1m Very hardy and excellent for streambank stabilisation Attractive foliage Dense cover for small birds, insects, skinks Works well aesthetically and for habitat value as 'mass planting' 	
Carex gaudichandiana Tea tree swamp sedge	 Sedge to 1m Prefers damp areas such as pond edges but will tolerate periodic dry Attractive, insect-attracting plant for erosion control, bank stabilisation etc. 	
Crinum pedunculatum River lily	 Lily to 1.5m Versatile Suitable for wet areas Attractive foliage 	

Shrubs: Hardy, colourful bird and insect-attracting plants that provide structure and protection

SPECIES	HABITAT FEATURES	TYPICAL HABIT
Melastoma affine Blue tongue	 Shrub to 2.5m with attractive foliage and beautiful pale pink flowers Fast growing and hardy Regular pruning increases bushiness providing protection for small birds. Insect attracting 	
Banksia oblongifolia Dwarf banksia	 Banksia to 2m Hardy. Tolerates poor soil Produces large cream flowers with abundant nectar Dense foliage provides excellent habitat for small birds

Banksia integrifolia Coast banksia	 Height around 8m Very hardy Tolerates poor soil Valuable for winter nectar production Great form as a feature tree Attractive foliage 	
Banksia aemula Wallum banksia	 Height around 5m Very hardy including in poor soil Large cream flowers attractive to insects and birds Dense foliage for bird protection 	
Acmena hemilampra Broad-leaved lilly pilly	 Height around 8m Very hardy and good screen plant Attractive foliage changing colour with growth Dense foliage for habitat value Small cream flowers. Fruit attractive to insects and birds 	
Acronychia imperforata Beach acronychia	 Height around 6m Attractive glossy foliage Yellow fruit Hardy in poor soil 	
Syzygium leuhmanii Riberry	 Height around 8m Very hardy Excellent screen plant Attractive foliage that changes colour with growth Dense foliage for habitat value Small cream flowers and attractive red fruit for insects and birds
